



On 25 th October 2020, the NSS Unit of Bharati Vidyapeeth's College of Engineering for Women visited Rajgad Fort on the occasion of Dasara. Dussehra, also known as Dasara or Vijayadashami, is a Hindu event remembering Rama's victory over Ravana, the 10-headed demon king who kidnapped Rama's wife, Sita. Dussehra, which represents the triumph of good over evil, is celebrated on the 10th day of the seventh month of the Hindu calendar, with the emergence of the full moon, an occasion known as the "bright fortnight" (shukla paksha).

This visit was carried out by about 8 NSS volunteers along with NSS Program OfficersProf. S A Itkarkar. The Rajgad Fort is well maintained. At the time, it was a Rajdhani of Chatrapati Shivaji Maharaj. It is located 4250 feet above sea level. There is a lot of beauty in the landscape and surroundings. This fort is located between the Sahyadri Ranges. Fort conservation initiatives such as Cleanliness Drive, Swachhta, and Shramdaan were carried out there.



As a result, it is also known as Sonori Fort. Malhargad is one of the forts on one side of the Sahyadri Mountains, along with Purandar, Sinhagad, and Vajragad. This section of the Sahyadris is known as the Bhuleshwar Range, and it runs east-west in the Western Ghats.

On March 21, 2020, an NSS unit from Bharati Vidyapeeth College of Engineering for Women, together with three volunteers and NSS Officers Prof. S A Itkarkar and Prof. Dr. Sonali Kadam, paid a visit to this fort. They discovered that Malhargad Fort, like the other hill forts, is popular for trekking and a fast escape. On weekends, it is commonly frequented by residents who live nearby.

A historic building, a palace belonging to the Panse Family, can also be seen in Sonori's base village. Despite the fact that much of the palace is in ruins, the Malhargad Fort is remarkably well preserved. Visitors may hike up to the fort, visit the structures, and enjoy a breathtaking view of the Sahyadri Mountain Ranges.

At night, firecrackers are fired off, processions of adorned deities parade through the streets, and oil lights are placed adrift on the river.
